


EXCELLENCE, SERVICE AND PROFESSIONALISM (ESP) IN PHILIPPINE LIBRARIANSHIP: NATIONAL AGENDA AND GLOBAL REALITIES AFTER RA 9246 AND BEYOND



Davao Association of Colleges and Universities Network Library Committee



October 8, 2003 marks the significant event when Davao Colleges and Universities' Network (DACUN) Library Committee was born. The fifth committee created by the executive board which composed of directors and university librarians from 12 interested colleges and universities in Davao City. Primarily, DACUN wishes to respond to the emergent needs along with information and services of the academic institutions both in private and in public.

On January 8, 2004, the first set of officers of the DACUN Library Committee was selected and Dr. Briccio M. Merced, Jr. of UP-Min was elected as the chairman and co-chaired by Alma P. Lacerna of the Philippine Women's College (PWC). The Library Committee, as one of the important committees created, became active and official after the signing of the Memorandum of Agreement on library cooperation, linkages, and networking on June 10, 2004 at the Assumption College of Davao. The ceremony was participated and witnessed by the presidents and official representatives of the member institutions, and the Library Committee themselves. Stipulated in the MOA are the guidelines concerning inter-library use.

The first seminar-workshop was premiered on September 9, 2004 and the PWC was the first institution to host the seminar on promoting archives and museum. The determination of the committee does not limit on what is traditional. They also ventured on the application of technology for the advancement of library services in particular. Until, on August 14-17, 2007 the Philippine-Book, Information, Science, and Technology (Phil-BIST) Conference and Fair was established. The University of Mindanao was the first to host the 1st PHIL-BIST. From then on, the month of August marked as the official month for the committee to conduct seminars and workshops in time for the celebration of the Kadayawan Festival, and the "Phil-BIST Conference and Fair" is the motif of the event. The conference and fair is a good avenue to reach-out to all information professionals in the country.

The programs and projects of the Library Committee came into fruition when the DACUN library committee newsletter first published on October 8, 2004. The DACUN Abstract International or DAI and DACUN Index to Periodicals or DIP were also materialized. The creation of technical working group was also recognized to facilitate the making of the DAI and DIP and gathering of data for the content and information organization. The first set of indexers was spearheaded by Melinda B. Alba of ACD, and first set of abstractors was convened by Rufina S. Balansag of UIC.

In November 30, 2005, the maiden print issue of DAI and DIP was launched and its 2nd volume with CD format was publicly launched same month in 2006. The third publication dubbed as the "back to back" version plus all-in-one CD ROM format of DAI and DIP with special bonus contents from volumes 1 and 2 sprang on August 11, 2009.

This year, 10 member institutions of the DACUN Library Committee celebrate 10 years of fruitful and rewarding years and unconditional and untiring dedication in molding information specialists to be effective and efficient as disseminators of knowledge and information.

Ten years of determination and willpower in creating excellence, upgrading services, and continuous education to retain professionalism have always been initiated. Persistent seminars, workshops and book fairs are delivered each year and were greatly supported.

Failures and successes shape the DACUN Library Committee into what it is today. Ten years of continuous improvement and advancement of professionalism in librarianship, have reaped for the Committee plaudits and compliments from professional associations and organizations. Triumphs and achievements have, likewise, fueled the passion of Committee members to pursue relentlessly its determined effort at further seeking for excellence, committed service, and professionalism.

DACUN SYMBOL

The symbol of the DACUN library committee made significant role which figured unity and toughen the bond relationship among members.

This first DACUN Library Committee logo signifies the strategic location of the 10 member institutions in Davao City. The Map of Davao City proves that education is a priority program of the city government of Davao. These DACUN member institutions join forces to provide information and are certain in sharing their respective resources without cost. The spheres connected as one network significantly means group of people which are held together by common points of interest.

The ic³KS insignia is a symbol of transformation. The idea of continuing education marks the application of information technology towards advancement among libraries not to mention the complexities it may produce. The new logo concept was initiated in time of the 1st Phil-BIST (Book, Information, Science, and Technology) conference and fair dubbed as ic³KS which stands for information, Content, Communication, and Connectivity in a Knowledge Society.

The logo of the DACUN which symbolizes unity and friendship among giant universities and colleges in Davao City. They are unified with each other's library resources, research and extension developments, student services, and cultural activities.



The Library Committee Davao Colleges and Universities Network DACUN



Celebrating milestones, such as this 10th year of the Library Committee and the 7th anniversary of Phil-BIST, did not cross my mind, nay my wildest dreams when I convened, together with nine beautiful ladies, the DACUN Library Committee in the year 2003 at the UP Mindanao, Anda campus, Davao City. After exchanging some pleasantries, and a little conversation that borders on mature topics (we were too old to talk about the latest teleserye), we plotted a destiny that, never did we think, would alter the landscape of librarianship in this part of the archipelago.

Networking was the buzzword of the techie-nerd, which we were not, even up to this day. The original ten did not comprehend it, much less encountered in library science school.

The rest, as they say, is history. After talking non-sense but with a little direction (you had to be sensible when talking to the late Sr. Maxima Remata, RVM of UIC, and remain prim and proper as you face the late Ligaya Marquez of HCDC), deliberating without terminating, meeting monthly just so we could divert ourselves from the rigors of shelving and calling the attention of students who disturb the peace of our libraries (most USEP Obrero campus students cower when the late Teresita Eco approached them), we finally found the light at the end of a long-dark tunnel. A niche, so to speak, had been carved, polished, and became the standards by which other networked libraries and librarians, not only in Davao City and Region, but in Mindanao and the entire country, benchmarked their programs and activities.

Rounding up our ten-year existence are: a memorandum of agreement (MOA) signed at the Assumption College of Davao, that defines and outlines who we are and what we are supposed to undertake; two recognized publications (DAI and DIP), while a third would be launched this year, the DMMI or the DACUN Multimedia Index; continuing professional education programs and services; human resource development; extension, networking and linkages; Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) accreditation, national recognition and global reach, among others. Perseverance, hard work, dedication, determination, and commitment, fired with the drive to excel, render incomparable service, and the passion for professionalism, all shaped what the Committee is today. To say that we are the toast of professional associations is an understatement. Not only did we receive the support and encouragement of the DACUN Executive Board, but also the Committee is a recipient of the same from private individuals and organizations, government agencies, and socio-civic-cultural associations. A support par excellence in the history of librarianship in the Philippines. But, life and existence are not always colored with laughter; sadness also lurked behind the corner. We witnessed the passing away of our colleagues in the profession. We also missed the camaraderie and companionship shared by PWC's Alma Lacerna and Melinda Belangel-Alba, UIC's Rufina Balansag and Denan Carino, HCDC's Angelita Bisares, and Gina Bendejo of ACD, who have moved on to other endeavors and institutions. We had to let go of members of our Technical Working Groups for Abstracting and Indexing, who have found greener pastures around the world.

DACUN, indeed, is a training ground for leaders, managers, thinkers, technical workers, and experts in the library and information science field. This feat was made manifest when two of us (yours truly, and Prof. Virginia 1. Caintic of UM) brought laurels and pride to the Library Committee by winning the coveted Outstanding Academic Librarian Award from the Philippine Association of Academic and Research Libraries (PAARL), and the Erasmus Mundi scholarship of Dr. Estela Dequito of Davao Doctors College, to Belgium. The DACUN Library Committee was the subject of a focus group discussion on networking and linkages in the country, as well as in national for a and conferences. No matter what life may bring, whether in bad or good clime, librarianship, like a growing organism according to Ranganathan, has to continue moving. This is what we set to do in the Committee. As we close another year and chapter of our existence, we open another chapter of relevant, meaningful, and fulfilling celebrations in succeeding anniversaries.

CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

Continuing education tops the Committee's commitment to advocate excellence, upgrade service, and uphold professionalism among all librarians in country. Granted by the PRC CPE Provider Accreditation No. 2009-013, several seminar, workshops, and trainings were initiated to help information professionals with the trends keep abreast and applications not only to upgrade information delivery services but also to facilitate upbringings and be models to the community where each librarian belongs. The sequential and momentous events in conducting seminar-workshops from 2004 up to the Philippine - Book, Information, Science, and Technology (Phil-BIST) marks the successes of the Library Committee.

The Philippine Women's College hosted the premier seminar sponsored by the Library Committee dubbed as **"The Role of Libraries in the Promotion of Archives and Museums"** on September 9, 2004. The Head Librarian of the host institution, Alma P. Lacerna, tours visitors and participants to the PWC's pride of preserving memorabilia and creating museum as sanctuary of history not only of PWC but the Davao Region in general.





CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

Many librarians in Davao Region have responded to the call of preserving and promoting institutional memories from the past, happenings in the present and even in the future.

Immediately on July 14-15, 2005, the major plan of creating a publication on resource sharing slowly came to realize. The Technical Working Group or TWG for indexers and abstractors organized a seminarworkshop on *"Abstracting and Indexing"* held at the Assumption College of Davao.

On March 3, 2006, another seminar-workshop entitled "Enhancing Skills on Abstracting" was organized by the Technical Working Group for Abstractors held at the Knowledge for Development Center of the University of Southeastern Philippines. This was an activity to educate more the abstractors and for them to come up with a unified standard not only for abstracting theses and dissertations but also indexing periodicals.





CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

On the other hand, the Library Committee spearheaded by Dr. Briccio M. Merced, Jr. conducted a free echoseminar on the 13th Congress of Southeast Asian Libraries or CONSAL which was held on April 27, 2006 at the Balay Alumni , Brokenshire College. This was the idea of sharing the library committee's learnings since not all the librarians have the opportunity to attend the CONSAL . Attended by over 30 participants who are librarians in Davao Region, the Library Committee were also the speakers and shared their expertise on Library Avant Garde; Preservation, Conservation, and Copyright; Library Resources Sharing; Library Profession; Library Training and Development; and Library Education.



CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

Another distinctive professional was organized and was education labeled as The combo seminarworkshop with the theme "Developing Non-Traditional and Organizing Library Resources and Packaging Project Proposal for Library Development", November 28-29, 2006 at the Holy Cross of Davao College. It is a 2-in-1 seminar on information sources organization and project proposal preparation. The activity became a venue to launch the maiden issue of the DAI and DIP in electronic format. This was the evidence of the realization of the library committee's greatest desire of coming up with a publication on resource sharing.





The library committee thought of something unique in providing education among information professionals and be updated with the advancement that the technology has brought to this information age. The brainstorming and commitment of the librarv committee and with consideration of technological advancement and information overload, the idea of creating Philippine-Book, Information, Science and Technology or Phil-BIST was realized.

The first Phil-BIST sprang on August 14-17, 2007 which was hosted by the University of Mindanao called as *IC³KS (Information, Content, Communication, and Connectivity in a Knowledge Society)*. the event was packed with information on communication, information connectivity, information and the professional, the knowledge society and the information and content building.

With the success of the first Phil-BIST and the significance it underlined in terms of library development and professional growth, the committee agreed to conduct same activity where the month of August will be the month of Library Committee's activities in time for the celebration of the Kadayawan festival in Davao City.

The cordial support of the executive board inspires the library committee to strive more and be ambitious in providing education and resources for better facilities among libraries and quality education among DACUN member institutions. The Library Committee would like to build a constant communication among librarians where they are in the world.

The Phil-BIST continued and the 2nd conference and fair was held in the Philippine Women's College's Audio Visual Room on August 13-15, 2008 with the theme **"Emerging Landscape, Mindscape, and Netscape of the PHIL-BIST for quality services"**. This seminar was participated even by Filipino librarians abroad. Also, it was supported by different booksellers all over the country with endorsements from the teachers of Library Science and librarians and library associations, Commission on Higher Education and the Department of Education.





CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

With the aim to continue providing a venue to improve academic landscape in Davao and transforming higher education institutions, the 3rd Phil-BIST was again organized. This is a 4-day seminar-workshop which was held in Brokenshire Resource and Convention Center, Brokenshire College on August 11-14, 2009 with the theme "Global Recession and Security Threats to Library and Information Systems: Hard and Soft Management Solutions to Improve Efficiency and Productivity". Aside from the Commission on Higher Education, the seminar was especially endorsed by the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA) and Cisco Systems, Inc., and was graced by the Chairman of the Dr. Dennis National Book Development Board (NBDB) Т. Gonzales. The 3rd Phil-BIST was jam-packed with activities were the 3rd volume of the DAI and DIP was also publicly launched and the consultation activities with association presidents of the Philippine Librarians Association (PLAI), Philippine Association of Academic Research Libraries, Inc. (PAARL), Philippine Association of Teachers in Library and Information Science (PATLS), Mindanao Alliance of Educators in Library and Information Science (MAELIS), Board for Librarians (BL), and the DACUN library committee was also featured.



On October 14-15, 2010 was the 4th year of library committee's aim for progress. That is why the continuing education in the field of librarianship extended professors, to information managers and specialists, government planners, private sector advocates, and industry players , and were warmly invited in the 4th Phil-BIST conference and fair at the Audio-Visual Room of the University of the Immaculate Conception with the theme "Sustaining Progress and Development With Global Standards for Networked Philippine Libraries and Information Centers". The seminar is not only for those who wanted to be updated with the latest trends and to refresh knowledge on library networking but was also a venue for widest live selection of content and information technology applications and system ever held in Mindanao and outside of the National Capital Region provided by booksellers and publishers, locally and globally.

The 4th Phil-BIST also became an event where the 4th volume of the DAI and DIP was launched. This motivated the participants to get their own copies since the DAI and DIP also a great help for the library and information science graduates as abstracting and indexing are the subjects included in the Librarian Licensure Examination. Moreover, speakers of the event were highly acclaimed in their field of expertise.

For the 5th time, the library committee held another conference and fair with the theme "Mapping the 21st century Filipino Librarians Role and Core Values for Intellectual and Social Responsibility" on August 18-19, 2010. The Davao Doctor's College was the host institution.

The said conference was loaded with information on digitizing library resources using Greenstone Software, in which Dr. Estela R. Dequito was the speaker. This is her way of sharing her education she acquired from her scholarship in Belgium. Another information on conducting library research was also considered which was graced by Dr. Nora G. Agustero. The challenges of web 3.0 and scaling online learning e-resources was also discussed by Prof. Elvira Lapuz and Prof. Arabella Ananoria who also shared on librarianship and its role in the society. The board member of the Board for Librarians, Prof. Corazon M. Nera was the guest of honor.



PUBLICATIONS

The DACUN Library Committee Newsletter, the official publication of the DACUN library committee first published in October 8, 2004. This is the news network about the committee's plans, activities, programs, projects, and accomplishments.



DAI and DIP with topics on social sciences launched on November 30, 2005 at the AVR, GT Hall, UM Matina in time of the celebration of the National book and information week. The Technical Working Group (TWG) was created to ensure the quality in terms of content and information organization. The members were the expert abstractors and indexers of the DACUN member institutions and said to be the library's cream of the crop.



PUBLICATIONS

All the periodicals and theses and dissertations in various disciplines were indexed and made abstracts, respectively. These were compiled and ultimately produced a printed copy of DAI and DIP, and made useful in locating reliable resources. The DAI and DIP are the great realization of the member's strategy to incorporate all basic information of the periodicals and of the theses and dissertations available in each member <u>institution</u>.





Both DAI and DIP are granted with ISSN numbers 1908-3298 and 1908-238X, respectively. CD ROM version of the DAI and DIP was launched on November 29, 2006 at the AVR of HCDC. The 1st edition contained 4 issues of the printed formats feature social science, humanities, and arts.



The third publication of the DAI and DIP, volume III No. 1, launched on August 11, 2009, is uniquely designed since it is packaged as one dubbed as the back to back version plus all-in-one CD ROM format of DAI and DIP with special bonus contents from volumes 1 and 2.





realization The for the publication of the DAI and DIP was supported by the Philippine Library Project Materials, Inc. (PLMP). Surprisingly in April 2006, Rogelio M. Mallillin, Director of the PLMP, spread the good news through a letter, granting the DACUN Library Committee of a financial assistance in of Php 50,000.00 to the amount sustain the production of DAI and DIP and eventually with electronic version.



PLMP is a registered non-governmental, non-profit corporation in the Philippines founded by the Ateneo universities. It started as ALMP (Ateneo Library Materials Project), a network of five Ateneo libraries. Soon it was discovered that not only the Ateneos could benefit from the project but also many other Philippine colleges and universities. So it became the **Philippine Library Materials Project (PLMP).** It's main objective is to help expand library resources and improve research capabilities by obtaining materials abroad and distribute to academic institutions in the Philippines. Looking back to its humble beginning, the Library Committee is the 5th committee which was organized by DACUN itself. This committee is composed of directors of libraries and University librarians from giants and prestigious academic institutions in Davao City. The first set of officers were lined up and voted among 10 member institutions.

These dynamic people persevered and endured to support the academic needs. Their brain connections made them eager and jubilant to initiate professional competitiveness. They never stop thinking and planning significant ideas to make the activities new and unique. They never allow hindrances in getting the success they deserve.

The first DACUN Library Committee set of officers were selected momentarily at the Philippine Women's College. Dr. Briccio M. Merced, Jr. of UP-Min was elected as the chairperson and co-chaired by Alma P. Lacerna of PWC. The secretary position was voted for Melenda A. Belangel of ACD; S. Ma. Maxima Remata, RVM of UIC as treasurer; and Conchita Butiu of UM as auditor but was later replaced by Virginia I. Caintic. . Chairpersons on continuing education, programs and projects, socio-cultural affairs, ways and means, and public information were Dr. Estela R. Dequito (DDC), Ma. Vismin D. Tagabucba (SPC), Teresita O. Eco (USeP), Joy Nemeno (BC), and Ligaya Marquez (HCDC), respectively.

Later on, the set of officers changed and acknowledged Ms. Rebecca Ynion, Venus L. De Castro, Angelita L. Bisares, and Rufina S. Balansag of the Rizal Memorial Colleges, Brokeshire College, Holy Cross of Davao Colleges, and University of the Immaculate Conception, respectively.

These people are catalysts of change. Basically, they aimed for reinvention, transformation and continuing education among libraries to build a research minded academic community.

DACUN MILESTONES The Technical Working Group for Indexers and Abstractors

With the aim to strengthen linkage among members of DACUN through resource sharing, the technical working group for indexers and abstractors was instinctively created.

One of the projects schemed by the members is the creation of the DACUN Index to Periodicals or DIP and DACUN Abstract International or DAI shortly after the conduct of seminar-workshop on Abstracting and indexing on July 14-15, 2005 at the Assumption College of Davao. 




